***Compliance and Monitoring of Performance
Goals and Indicators***

Adopted: 06/11/2025

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It is the responsibility of each member local education agency (LEA) to comply with the requirements of the performance goals and indicators developed by the California Department of Education (CDE) and provide data as required by the CDE to California Longitudinal Pupil Achievement Data System (CALPADS).

The Tuolumne County Special Education Local Plan Area (SELPA) will provide the ongoing review of special education programs within Tuolumne County and establish procedures and a mechanism for correcting any identified problem.

Ongoing Review of Program Monitoring activities by the Tuolumne County SELPA to meet Education Code requirements shall include but not be limited to the following:

- Observation of special education programs operated by each SELPA member LEA
- Periodic review of Individualized Education Program (IEP) documents developed by LEA IEP Teams
- Analysis of LEA key performance indicator data
- Review and analysis of LEA CALPADS data
- Participation in the state's designated quality assurance processes (i.e., Compliance Improvement Monitoring, Cyclical Monitoring for Small LEAs, IEP Implementation)
- Reviews and follow-up corrective action activities
- Participation in selected LEA IEP Team meetings
- Review of selected LEA assessment reports
- Delivery of ongoing training and support to ensure compliance with special education procedures.

Procedure for correction of identified problems shall be carried out through the following means:

- Consultation with the administrative personnel responsible for the LEA's special education programs
- Provision of training and technical assistance as necessary to clarify compliant practices with appropriate LEA staff
- Assistance with correction of non-compliant procedures or practices identified through state or local compliance complaint investigations.

In cases where the identified problem persists following implementation of such steps as outlined above, the LEA superintendent or executive director shall be notified regarding the issue.
